Briber Sentenced

Grand Rapids Mich June 6—Lant K. Salisbury, former city attorney, convicted of conspiracy in connection with frauds by which Omaha and New York capitalists paid \$75,000 to city officials in an attempt to secure the waterworks concession from Grand Rapids, and who later turned states evidence and by his testimony aided in sending a number of former prominent officials to the penitentiary, today was sentenced to pay a fine of \$2000 or serve a year's imprisonment. He paid the fine. Salisbury has already served two years in the Detroit house of correction in connection with the waterworks bribery.
