Washington June 8—A delegation of merchants from Muskego, I. T. arrived here today to protest to the President and the Secretary of the Interior against the collection of the tribal tax assessed against the white men doing business in the Territory. They ask a delay of the collection in order to take the case to the Supreme Court.

New Ministers

Christiana June 8—M. Laevland has been appointed minister of foreign affairs for the new Government. All the officers of the army and navy today took the oath of allegiance. The Norwegian diplomatic officers at Stockholm have been recalled. Fridtjof Naasen was appointed ambassador to England and former Premier Hagerup was appointed ambassador to Berlin.

Want Conference

London June 8—Germany has sent the identical note to all the powers signatory of the Madrid convention proposing an international conference on the question of Morocco. It is understood that none of the powers have yet replied.

Oscar Refuses

Stockholm Sweden June 8—King Oscar has refused to receive the deputation appointed by the present Norwegian Storting. He wired "As I do not recognize the revolutionary steps which the Storting in violation of the constitution and act of union, and in revolt against its king, have unfortunately taken, I decline to receive the delegation. The King is receiving many telegrams from all parts of the kingdom expressing sympathy and devotion. The Council of state has decided to call an extra session of the Swedish parliament to deal with the situation.

Submarine Explodes

Plymouth, England June 8—While the submarine "A-8" was manouevring off the port this morning, three explosions occurred and the boat sank. Of eighteen men aboard the vessel, only four were rescued. Divers are at work on the sunk vessel.

The submarine lies in eight fathoms. The first intimation of the disaster came when the submarine could not come to the surface. The signal received shortly before noon said "all right." Up to the present time those saved were standing in the vicinity of the conning tower at the time of the disaster and were picked up by a passing trawler.

The survivors were unable to explain the cause of the accident. They said that the submarine suddenly tipped while the hatches were open, immediately filled and sank.

GRAVE RUMORS OF COMPLICATION

New York June 8—The sailing of a squadron to France to bring home the body of John Paul Jones has been "indefinitely postponed" by orders of the war department. Reports are current that the delay is due to "grave foreign complications," one of which, it is said, is the discovery that Germany has secured a strategic base in the Caribbean Sea for a coaling station and water on the island of St. Thomas, through the medium of the Hamburg American line. The trouble over the interment of the Russian cruisers at Manila is also given as a cause of the postponement of the sailing of the vessels. Admiral Sigbee is still in Washington.
