UNIQUE OBSERVATION CARS

A decided novelty in railway passenger equipment is about to be introduced by the Denver & Rio Grande railroad company in Colorado and will undoubtedly create widespread comment. The company is now preparing to install new observation cars, entirely without tops and with sides only high enough to prevent passengers from falling from them. These open-top observation cars, as they are called, are now being built for the Rio Grande and will be attached during the summer months to the daylight trains running through the Royal Gorge, Canon of the Grand River and the Black Canon of the Gannison. They will be completed and placed in service not later than June 10th of this year.

These cars are of model construction and have a seating capacity of 75 persons. They will have low sides but no tops, being entirely open and giving a free and unobstructed view of the scenery. No charge is to be made for seats in these cars, and they will be put on the trains during the day at Canon City and will be run probably to Salida and return. The same arrangements will be made at the entrance and exits of the other canons of the road.

WIRELESS MESSAGE FROM TRAIN

Chicago June 10—Wireless telegrams were yesterday sent to and from the Alton limited train when running at a rate of a mile a minute, from here to St. Louis. So satisfactory was the test that President Felton has decided that all passenger trains on the Chicago & Alton railroad shall be equipped to send and receive wireless messages.

Today wireless messages will be exchanged between the Alton limited trains, north bound and south bound, while both are running at full speed, while one is running and the other is standing still and when both trains have stopped. Wireless messages will also be sent to both trains from Chicago, Springfield and St. Louis and from the trains while at these cities.

The main object of the Alton road in equipping passenger trains with wireless is to still further decrease the risk of accident.
