**New Switch Engines**  
Special engineer John S. Reese, arrived in the city Thursday with two of the new yard or switch engines which the O. R. & N. has purchased, and is now busily engaged in setting them up in the yards at this place. These engines are made especially for switching in the yards, manufactured by the Baldwin company at Philadelphia, Pa. Mr. Reese met the engines at Omaha, Neb., and brought them from that place here. These engines are a great deal larger than the ones now in use in most of the O. R. & N. yards and are furnished with all the modern appliances that have been invented for engines of this type. They are numbered 21 and 22, each engine weighing 145,300 pounds and being equipped with straight and automatic air. The tenders weigh ninety thousand pounds equipped for service, having a capacity of four thousand gallons of water and six tons of coal. No 21 has already been set up and was given a test in the yards here yesterday afternoon proving entirely satisfactory. Mr. Reese will finish the setting up of No 22 today, and both engines will be ready for immediate service. Two more engines of this type have been ordered by the O. R. & N., and will arrive here in two weeks. One of the engines will be used in the yards at this place, one at Pendleton, one at Umatilla and the other probably at Huntington. The two engines now enroute will be set up by Mr. Reese in the shops at this place.

**Automobile Line**  
An automobile line was put on between Independence and Salem. There is a missing link of twelve miles between these two points in the transportation facilities of the Valley. For years there has been talk of a motor connecting the Southern Pacific lines on the East and West Sides. This Spring the roads have been improved and the automobile brought the solution.

**Heavy Traffic**  
On account of the heavy traffic from the east to the Lewis and Clark fair, the O. R. & N. has arranged to handle the business more expeditiously between Huntington and Umatilla, and have eight new engines, four of them passenger engines of the counter balance type, and four heavy switch engines. The engines have been brought to the shops here, where they will at once be set up for service.

**Herd Coming**  
The Elka of La Grande have issued invitations to all the Best People on Earth residing in Oregon to be present in the best sugar town on June 15, on which occasion a "hobo social" will be held. A herd from Baker will be there with both feet.—Baker City Maverick.

**Sugar Co. Organizes**  
Salt Lake June 12—The Western Idaho Sugar company was formally floated at a meeting Saturday morning. The capital stock is \$2,000,000 in shares of \$10 each. The construction of two plants in western Idaho was authorized.
