Portland, Ore., June 15.—The 50th anniversary of the signing of the treaty between the United States and Great Britain, establishing the 49th parallel as the boundary line of the Northwest was commemorated today by the dedication of the Oregon building at the Lewis and Clark exposition and the delivery of the exposition buildings by the state commission to Governor George E. Chamberlain with appropriate ceremonies.

Driscoll's Statements

Chicago, Ill., June 14.—John O. Driscoll, who claims to have settled four hundred strikes by the use of money aggregating fifty thousand dollars, this afternoon gave the grand jury mass details concerning the alleged corruption in labor circles, and showing the "blackmail" extortions which have been practiced in Chicago for years, especially by the teamsters. Mr. Driscoll admitted that he received a salary of over two thousand dollars a month for adjusting strikes, but claimed that his work was legitimate and that he never received any grafts himself.

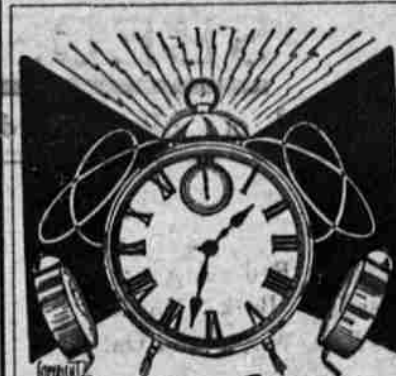
