Delcasse. The selection of a new minister of finance will be made tonight or tomorrow.

Preparing Final Report

Portland June 15—The National Louisiana Purchase exposition committee, holding its final session here, is preparing a report to be submitted to President Roosevelt regarding the awards made by the exposition company which have been protested.

SENATOR FULTON NAMES FIVE

It is reported from an authoritative source that United States Senator Fulton has presented President Roosevelt with a list of five names, bearing the Senator's personal endorsement, for the office of federal judge of the district.

The only name which is reported authoritatively as having been upon the list, is that of Senator John T. Hand, of Baker City, but it is rumored that the other candidates named are Justice Beau of Eugene, of the supreme court, Judge McBride of Oregon City, Judge Webster of Portland, and Judge Carey of Portland.

Under the present circumstances it is stated, it is hard to determine how much influence Senator Fulton's endorsement will have and it is stated in some quarters that the president will rely upon the recommendation of Assistant United States Attorney General Robb, who was sent personally to this state by the president, to investigate the existing conditions and make report of a suitable man to fill the position made vacant by the demise of the late Judge Bellinger.—Pendleton Tribune.

Wants Ammunition

Berlin, June 16.—The Russian war office invited proposals from German ammunition works this week for 200,000,000 cartridges of all kinds, costing between \$1,500,000 and \$2,000,000, and also for considerable quantities of regulation infantry rifles. The largest arms and ammunition factories in Germany have been obliged to decline contracts because they have orders so far ahead from the Japanese, Russian and other foreign governments. "The business of manufacturing guns both large and small, is described as having never been so active in Germany as at present."

Bank Dividend

Receiver J. A. Reed of the defunct bank of Sumpter yesterday paid the creditors of that institution, under the orders of Referee in Bankruptcy J. B. Messick, thirty six and one half per cent of their claims against the bank. This money was realized from the sale of properties belonging to the bank made by the receiver, or trustee. Mr. Reed last night reported that the distribution of the dividends had been practically completed.—Baker City Democrat.
