Chance For Hoch

Chicago June 16—"Bluebeard" Johann Hoch, who was sentenced to be hanged June 23 for the murder of one of his wives, may be given one more chance to escape the gallows. His case may be taken to the supreme court of Illinois. In a conference held here today Governor Deussen assured counsel for Hoch that in case the state attorney's office is assured by Wednesday June 21, that sufficient money is forthcoming to provide for the preparation of the necessary record, a reprieve will be granted until the October term of the supreme court. The sum needed is \$700.

Got \$3600 Damages

Mrs Howard Haley, of Walls Walla whose husband was killed while working as a brakeman on the Walls Walla-Pendleton branch of the O R & N, has received \$3600 from the company in settlement of her claim for damages. She sued for \$20,000.

Special Rates

The railroad company has made special rates on all points on their line in this county of one and one third for the round trip to Union on Pioneer day, June 22. This makes the rate from La Grande 55 cents, and \$1.40 from Elgin.

School Election

The annual school election takes place next Monday at the High school building. The polls will be open from 2 o'clock until 6 in the afternoon. One director to serve for five years is to be elected at this time.

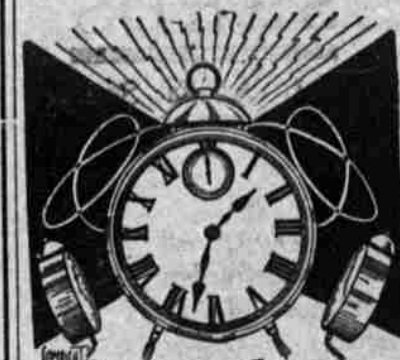
