SIBERIAN TOWN SCENE OF MASSACRE

San Francisco June 18—News of a terrible massacre of 150 natives on the Siberian coast has been received here in a letter from Petropavlovsk, on the coast of Kamchatka. A Morogranov has written to his brother, a resident of this city, that in the early part of the year the natives in one of the small settlements down the coast, which he does not name, observed a yacht or schooner drop anchor in the harbor, and her coming was hailed with cries of rejoicing.

Off from the vessel came a number of small boats. The natives could see the crew piling what they thought were supplies into the smaller craft. Then the men pulled for the shore. During that or the next day there was heard the firing of arms and later smoke and fire were observed. This led to an investigation from Petropavlovsk and other towns on the coast, and a horrible tale of pillage and massacre was brought to light.

About the streets of the settlement, writes Morogranov, were strewn the bodies of 150 of the inhabitants, shot and cut to death by the pirates, who, under the pretense of friendship, had gained a landing on the coast.

Robbery was their only motive, for every hut had been ransacked and anything of marketable value was taken. Who the marauders were those who did manage to make their escape, could not say, beyond giving the information that some Japanese were in the party. When Morogranov sent his letter the people of Petropavlovsk were afraid of an attack on that coast and were preparing for it.

Hopeful Signs

Christiana Norway June 19—The statement reaching here from Stockholm indicating that King Oscar personally is not opposed to the acceptance by a prince of the house of Bernadotte of the throne of Norway is commented upon in the most kindly manner by the Norwegian press.

It is believed that King Oscar's influence will go far with the riksdag, although it is conceded that the King, if he finds that the riksdag is unalterably opposed to this, will not change his official attitude. The statement in regard to King Oscar's personal feeling in this matter comes from a high source and is regarded here as one of the most hopeful signs of a peaceful settlement.

Hire Men

A wall, long, loud and plaintive, is going up from Hailey Idaho. The cause is that out of seven teachers there last year, five have resigned to get married. The epidemic is said to have also spread to the Hailey girls teaching at distant points and the citizens are greatly exercised over the matter. So discouraged are the directors that there are serious hints that they intend asking to be relieved of their arduous positions or will demand a large salary, as the work of keeping Hailey in school ma'am is too hard to be undertaken without pay.—Wolter
