THE STORTHING TO KING OSCAR

(Scripps News Association)

Christiana Norway June 20.—An address to King Oscar, adopted by the storthing yesterday in reply to King Oscar's letter of June 13th, was made public today. While it is of a conciliatory nature, it expresses the firm determination of Norway to the action taken in dissolving the union with Sweden and says:—"What has been happening recently in Norway was the inevitable result of the combination of late political events and cannot be altered, and it is certain that neither of the two peoples desire returning to the former condition of the union. The Storthing is of the opinion that it ought not to reconsider the various questions constitution and public law that has been brought up in your majesty's note to the Storthing." "The storthing recognizes his majesty's difficult position, and does not question but that he is performing his duty as he understands it. At the same time, the storthing desires a peaceful carrying through of the dissolution of the union and the safeguard of the friendship and concord of the two peoples of the peninsula. There was no desire on the part of Norway to mortify Sweden, but what happened, had to happen, and it was merely the inevitable maintenance of Norway's constitutional rights. The storthing has already stated that the Norwegian people do not feel any bitterness or animosity against your majesty or the Swedish people." The address also suggests that negotiations requisite for a final settlement on dissolution of the union, with the recognition of Norway's new status, and her rights as a sovereign state be undertaken. The address closed with the wish that the good relations of the two people may continue.

Driver Attacked

Chicago June 20.—Early this morning Edward Pickett a non-union driver for the National express was attacked on Madison street bridge by four men with the apparent purpose of maiming him. They deliberately broke two fingers of his right hand and inflicted four serious wounds on the head. Pickett is now in the hospital in a serious condition. His assailants escaped.
