Judge Eakin Elected

There was a determined effort that was in process of organization several days prior to the election to defeat Judge Eakin and it developed in to quite a strength but it was easily counteracted, and for an election that was supposed to be a mere formality it soon became one of intense interest, and during the last hour and half over one hundred and fifty votes were polled and this number would have been greatly increased if the polls had been kept open another hour, as during the last hour it just became to be generally known that the Judge, who did not seek the position, but only accepted the nomination after being petitioned by a great many of the leading citizens and property owners of this district, had any opposition.

The opposition kept their candidate in the dark not even placing him in nomination, but when the votes were counted, out of a total of 279 it developed that J. H. Lashman received 91 and Judge Eakin had 198. Of course the figures do not represent that the contest was close at any time, but when it is remembered that under general conditions, only about forty or sixty votes are cast on school elections, it was plain to see that the anti-Eakin organization would have succeeded, had not the Judge's friends recognized the movement early in the game and immediately went to the work.

Outlaw Found

Vernon, Texas June 20—Sam Hildebrand, the notorious outlaw who operated in Missouri, Texas and Arkansas nearly half a century ago, and is alleged to have committed 27 murders, may yet be arrested. He dropped out of sight in 1872 and for more than 30 years he was believed dead. A few days ago he was discovered living on a farm near Lawton, Okla. In a burst of confidence he revealed his identity to a neighbor, who informed the authorities. The old man learned he had been betrayed and disappeared before the officers arrived with a warrant for his arrest. He is said to be armed and is well able to a hard fight, despite the fact that he is more than 70 years old.

Broke His Neck

Hailey June 20—Walter Sharp the 10 year old son of James Sharp, a ranchman living on poverty flat near this place, lost his life yesterday as the result of a mishap. While racing horses with a young friend at Glendale, about 10 miles from Hailey. While the two lads were racing their horses along the highway a cow that was lying down beside the road suddenly rose and frightened the horse ridden by young Sharp. The boy was thrown from the horse and his neck broken. He died within a few minutes after the fall. The funeral will be held today.

Demand For Artillery

Berlin June 20—The war in the far east is causing such a demand for ammunition that the Germany artillery manufacturers are overrun with orders. The Krupp-Essen works have ordered the delivery of 3000 guns monthly or nearly two years.

The company which only recently built an artillery factory, making eight of these buildings, must soon begin to construct a ninth artillery foundry.
