The congressional committee on irrigation and reclamation of arid lands, composed of members appointed from the Senate and House of Representatives, will pass through this city in a special car attached to No 5, enroute to Portland. For some time this committee has been investigating the irrigation projects and the scenes where arid land may be reclaimed in California, Nevada, Arizona, Colorado and Idaho. Senator Chas W Fulton of Oregon passed through the city last night on No 2 to meet the distinguished guests in Idaho and bring them into Oregon. The members of the Senate and House committee are accompanied by a Congressional party of men well known in the halls of Congress, and also well known for their work in regard to irrigation and the reclamation of arid lands. Mr O J Blanchard and wife, who spent some time here last summer visiting the

family of the lady's mother, Capt J H Alexander, are also of the party. Capt Alexander and wife will join the party at this place and proceed with them to Portland.

REMOVAL FROM PORT ARTHUR

The Foo June 21—Reliable information states that, previous to the naval battle in the Japan sea, the Japanese commandant at Port Arthur notified the manager for Kunst & Albers, the most prominent mercantile house in Port Arthur, that in case the Japanese won the expected naval engagement he must be prepared to close up the business and leave Port Arthur. As soon as the result of the battle became known, all foreigners at Port Arthur were officially informed to prepare to depart and remove their merchandise within 40 days. The Japanese officials gave no explanation of this action.

Kunst & Albers applied to their head office at Hamburg to intercede for an extension of time. Filing to obtain this the manager prepared to depart for Shanghai to make arrangements for the shipment of his goods. He notified the Japanese authorities that he would soon return but was informed that he could not as foreigners would not be allowed to enter Port Arthur. The manager had to leave an attorney to represent him and then departed to arrange transportation. The manager for Sietas, Block & Co., who have large interests in Port Arthur, states that he will not comply with the order to remove his merchandise.
