MILLER ON TRIAL TODAY

Roy H. Miller, president of the defunct bank of Sumpter, is on trial today in the criminal court charged with obtaining money under false pretenses. The court room is crowded with interested spectators, and a number of Sumpter people are down as witnesses. It is expected that the taking of the testimony will consume two days' time.

The indictment against Miller, which was returned by the last term grand jury, charges that on February 23, 1904, in the city of Sumpter, he fraudulently and willfully represented to A. P. Goss that a certain certified check for \$15,000 on the First National bank of Sumpter, was a good and valid check and would be honored by the First National bank. With these misrepresentations he induced A. P. Goss to turn over to him, Miller, the property of the bank of Sumpter in payment for which he gave the \$15,000 certified check. The indictment then charges that at the time of making the transfer Miller knew the check was worthless and that it would not be honored.—Baker City Herald.

Idle Men Plentiful

Over 50 idle men have arrived in the city within the past week and many of them have scattered into the hay district and many more to the grain fields, where heading is now in progress. From all appearances now harvest hands will be plentiful. Most of those arriving now have every appearance of being workmen.—East Oregonian.

Are Consolidated

Chicago, June 22.—The consolidation of the National and Interstate Telephone Associations were effected at yesterday's session of the telephone convention in this city. James Hoge, of Cleveland, O., was elected president, and John Vanliaw, of California, second vice president.

The President's Position

She declared that the President chewed and smoked tobacco and was "no good anyway." 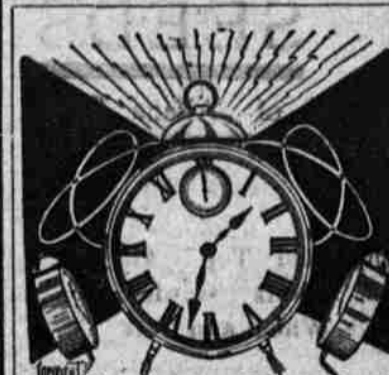
