Bounty Frauds

Helena Mont June 23—County Attorney Porter of Ouster County who is here, says that he has unearthed certain evidence of extensive bounty frauds in eastern Montana, made possible through collusion between bounty inspectors and "wollers" or persons who kill wild animals for bounty. He says frauds will run up as high as \$15,000 in one county. Several accused persons are under arrest and more arrests will follow.

Death List at Lodz

Lodz June 23—Twenty-two persons were killed last night when Cossacks fired into the procession of 60,000 workmen which had been organized as a Socialist demonstration against the government. Ten of the 100 wounded will die. Two women were crushed to death in the rush of panic-stricken crowds after the firing began. This morning, in revenge for last night's slaughter, some workmen shot and killed a Cossack and two policemen.
