IMPORTANT DUTY CALLS TO EUROPE

New York June 24—Assistant secretary of state Loomis was a passenger on the liner Philadelphia which sailed today for South Hampton. Loomis admitted that he was going for the government to receive the remains of John Paul Jones from the French authorities. He stated that an important duty had been assigned to him after being ordered to Europe on a mission of state, the nature of which he refused to divulge. He also declined to make a statement on Venezuelan matters.

Governor Resigns

Honolulu June 24—Governor Carter has mailed his resignation to President Roosevelt. He will leave here on June 28 for Washington to discuss the matter of his retirement from the governorship. He has been in cable correspondence with the President regarding it and has received permission to go to the capitol for a personal interview.

Governor Carter says that he has urged President Roosevelt to accept his resignation and appoint a successor. His action, it is declared, was not due to the election of A. M. Brown as high sheriff, but had been under consideration for some time.

The resignation was the culmination of a long series of events which led Governor Carter to the conclusion that he could be of more service to the territory of Hawaii outside the gubernatorial chair than in that position.
