## WOMAN SHOTS LAWYER HAYES

Goldfield, Nev. June 27—Charles Hayes, a prominent lawyer, formerly of Mono county, California, was seriously shot and perhaps fatally wounded by Mrs. G. S. Phoenix, the wife of a wealthy real estate and mining man last night. Phoenix and his wife sought to dispossess Hayes from a lot they bought from him. During the wrangle, who is an invalid, told his wife to shoot. She obeyed and fired three times, one bullet hitting Hayes in the groin, one in the hand and the other one missed. The woman surrendered and is held for an attempt at murder.

## GENERAL WOOD RETURNS HOME
