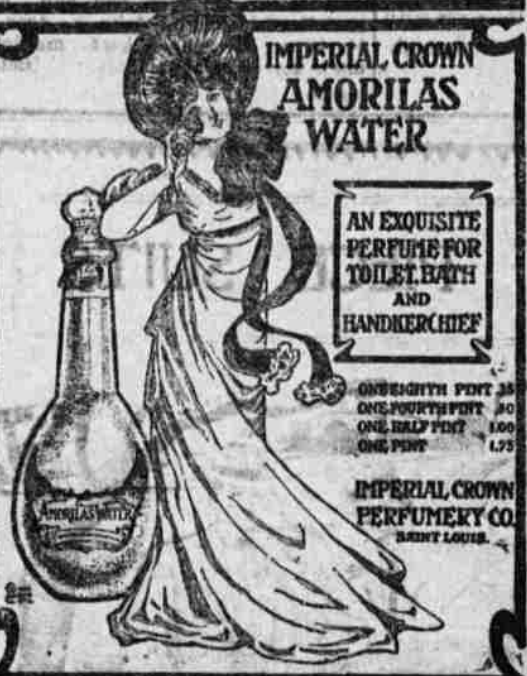

## Lumber For China

Portland Ore June 28—This afternoon the Pacific Export Lumber Company chartered the British steamship Ilford to load lumber at Portland for Taku China. She is in the orient and is expected to arrive the latter part of July.

The steamer will take out in the neighborhood of 3,500,000 feet of Oregon fir which will be secured at the Inman-Pooler mill. She is of 2,789 net register and was built four years ago at Northumberland, England. Her dimensions are 360 feet long, 48 feet beam and 20.0 feet of hold.

The British steamship Saduhurat and ship Dueraig are under charter to the same company to carry lumber to the far east. The Sandhurst is expected to arrive in a week or two and the sailing vessel early next month. The cargoes they will take out will aggregate 8,500,000 feet of lumber.

## PORTLAND MAN IS CONVICTED

Spokane, June 27.—Will O Gibson, a traveling man representing a firm of Portland, Ore., is in jail charged with an attempt at a holdup. Gibson has been identified as the man who entered Dann's saloon near the city hall about 4 o'clock this morning and struck Bartender William Boyd on the head with a heavy iron. The blow failed to stun Boyd and a fight followed, after which the robber fled but was captured in Davenport's restaurant.

Gibson, who is said to draw a salary of \$250 per month, was alleged to have been under the influence of liquor when the attempt to rob the saloon was made.

## Bids Opened

Salem, Or., June 27.—Bids for the services of Oregon convicts were opened yesterday, and ranged from 41 to 50 cents a day. Thirty five cents is the rate paid at present. The Airtight Stove company offered to pay 50 cents, but wanted to stipulate in the contract that not to exceed 100 men would be used. The Loewenberg Going company, present lessee, bid 41 cents. The second bid will be asked for by the state in order that the Airtight Stove company may make an acceptable offer.

## Claim German Victory

St. Petersburg, June 28.—Private advices from Paris say that Germany has achieved a diplomatic victory over France by reaching an agreement with Premier Rouvier for a settlement covering not only Morocco, but other questions by which it is presumed that Germany, like Great Britain, will secure compensation for quit claiming her interests in Morocco.

Germany's quid pro quo, according to report, will be obtained in the near east in recognition of her influence in Persia.

## Wallace Resigns

Washington June 29—John E. Wallace, chief engineer of the Panama canal and a member of the canal commission has resigned both positions to accept a \$60,000 office with a New York corporation. Wallace declined to state his reason for resigning, referring his questions to Secretary Taft.
