New Tabernacle

The scurrying of busy feet, the quick rasp of the trowel on the brick and the musical ring of the stone chisel upon the stone make the new Mormon tabernacle, which is in course of construction, sound like a very busy place, and it locks like a busy one too when approached. A large force of men is now at work on the building and it will be rapidly pushed to completion. Mr P Bousquet has the contract for the stone, brick and earpenter work and he expects to have the brick and stone work entirely completed by the middle of August.

The tabernacle is being constructed after the plans and specifications drawn by architect Thornton of this city, and when completed will be a model of beauty and convenience, a pride to the architect and builder, a credit to the members of the church. and an object for La Grande people to show visitors. Beside the stone work of the foundation and basement which has been completed for some time, there will be required nearly six hundred thousand brick in the construcbrick are on the ground at the present time, as are all the other materials needed for the work. Another large force of men will be put to work as soon as some rode and other material, which have been ordered, arrive. The tabernacie is one hundred and ten fees long and seventy four lest wide. The largest room, or auditorium, will seat one thousand two hundred people, and the place for the choir will seat eighty. Preparations are being made to begin the carpenter work as soon as the brick work has progressed sufficiently.
