More New Engines

And still the O R & N company continue to improve their system and add the newest and best machinery obtainable to their freight and passenger system. It has been but a few weeks since six monster mountain climbers arrived at La Grande and were placed on this end of the road in the freight service. Following this, the company bettered the service by adding four new and modern switch engines which were placed at points from Huntington to Portland, one of them being used in the yards at La Grande. Last evening two of the latest improved and most modern passenger engines were received here and will be set up in the shops at this place. After they are mantled and tested they will be used on the passenger run from Penikese to Huntington.

These engines are models of beauty and strength, made at the Baldwin Locomotive Works at Philadelphia, and have the latest improvements that man has devised for speed strength and safety. The engines are compound and the drive wheels are 77 inches in diameter, while the cylinder is twenty eight inches. The engines are numbered 195 and 196, the greatest difference between these and the others of the 190 class which are now in use on this road, being in the tanks. Instead of being cylindrical, the tanks are square and will hold nine thousand gallons, this being two thousand more than the other tanks will hold. Another change and improvement is that the tanks are fitted with vestibules, so that the car following will so closely connect that it will be as complete a vestibule on passenger cars between the passenger coaches. This will be a drawback to the knights of the road, commonly denominated "bobos" as it will then be impossible to "ride the blind"

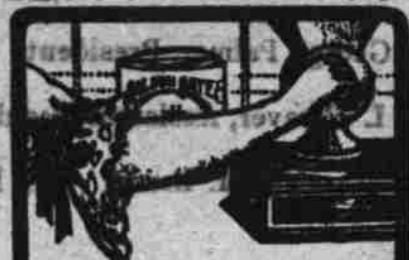
