## A NEW SEC'Y OF NAVY

Washington July 1—Charles J. Bonsharte, of Maryland was sworn in as Secretary of the Navy at ten o'clock this morning and took up his duties as successor to Paul Morton. As no commission had been signed by the President he may have to be sworn in again.

### Russia's Offer

St. Petersburg, July 1.—The Russian government has intimated to the British embassy its willingness to fund the officers of the British steamer St. Kilda, sunk by the Russian artillery cruiser Dnieper June 5, in the China sea, at Port Mait if desired, but suggests that it might be preferable for them to go to Libau and testify regarding the circumstances of the sinking of the steamer. The government also expressed its willingness to consider the question of compensation for the sinking of the St. Kilda, but a definite decision on this subject must await the result of the hearing before the prize court.

### Killed By Auto

New York July 1—Frank C. Foote, a chauffeur for James J. Hill of the Northern Pacific road, while running an automobile today, ran over and fatally injured an unknown woman at Charles and Greenwich streets. The woman died half an hour later. Foote was remanded to the corner. The chauffeur was on his way to court to be tried on a charge of speeding the automobile when he struck the woman. The police say Foote was running the machine carefully and that the woman's death was purely accidental.

The bullet had passed through his spleen and his veins were almost entirely bloodless. While the operation was in progress one of the physicians suddenly exclaimed: "He is dead, his heart has stopped beating!"
