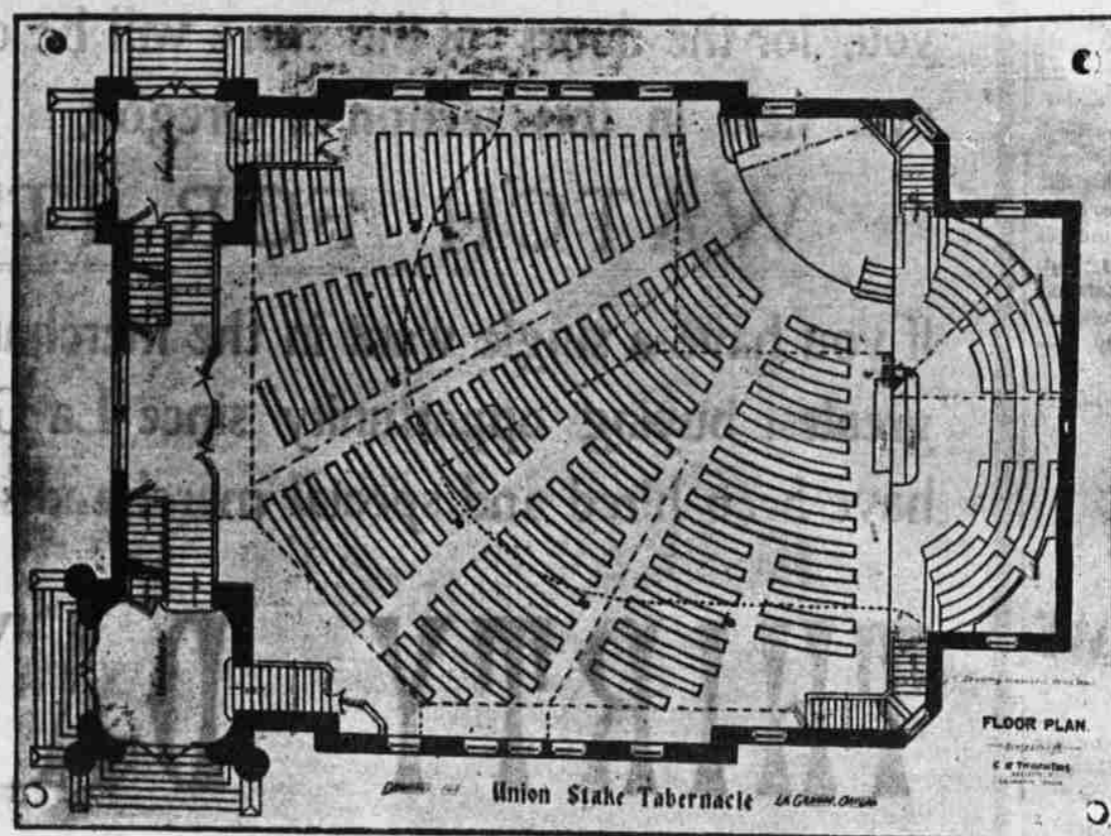
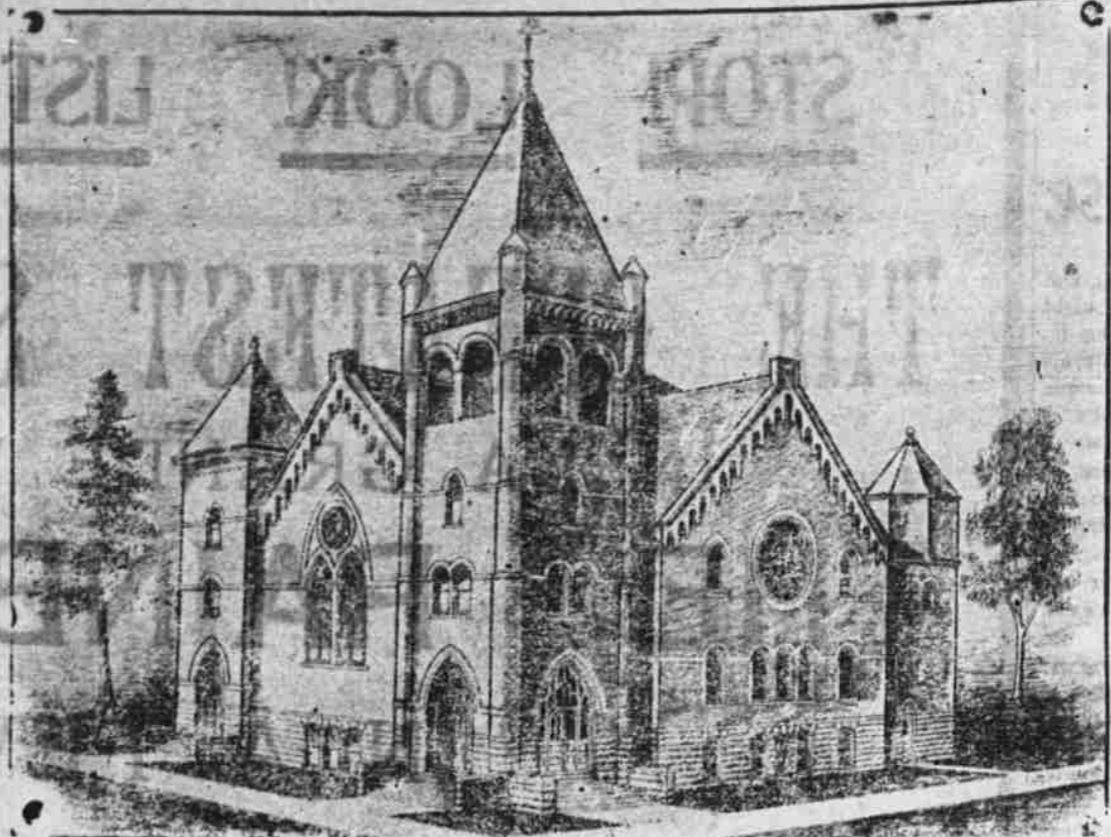

CONGRESSMEN MUST ENTER THEIR PLEAS

Who is now being tried in the Federal Courts.

Congressman J N Williamson, Van Gessner and Marjor R Riggs, who are indicted by the Federal Grand Jury for conspiracy to obtain Government lands fraudulently, will be tried Monday. The case has been set for this date, and the trial will proceed at once unless something unexpected occurs, as both sides seem ready to go into a trial of the case. Demurrers were entered in these cases, but were overruled by Judge Dehaven last Monday, and the defendants will be compelled to plead "not guilty" or "guilty" to the charge on next Monday. In the case against Senator Mitchell, Congressman Hinger Herman and Congressman J N Williamson, accused of conspiring in the Blue Mountain reserve lands, which came up on demurrer last Monday, June 26, the demurrer was overruled also, but the case has not been set for trial.
