PITCHER DOWLING KILLED BY TRAIN

Last night "Pete" Dowling, the pitcher for the La Grande ball team, was killed by passenger train No. 2 about one and a half miles west of Hot Lake. The facts in the case are rather meagre at present, but from the best reports obtainable it appears that Dowling, who, it is said, had been drinking rather heavily for the past few days, left Tuesday for Hot Lake to sober up and get in good form for the games here tomorrow and the Fourth. He had not been drinking while at Hot Lake and was expected to arrive here on passenger train No. 5 last evening. For some cause he failed to board the train at Hot Lake, but, after the train had passed coming west, he said to some of the people present at the depot that he would walk to La Grande, and started on the track in this direction. This was the last seen of him until he was struck by the train, passenger train No. 2, going east, and passenger train No. 5, going west passed at this place about nine o'clock and he was killed shortly after this. At the time he left Hot Lake, he had on his shoes, but when the body was found, he was in his stocking feet, and his head was completely severed from the body, being cut off close to the shoulders and as completely as if done with a knife. It is reported that the engineer said he did not see the man until he stepped upon the track in front of the engine when it was impossible to stop in time, but that he blew the whistle several times, Dowling paying no attention to the noise or the approaching train. Some think it was a case of deliberate suicide, and others think that he was in a state of delirium tremens, having been without intoxicants for some time, and that he was not aware of what he was doing. The head of the unfortunate man had not been found at the time of writing this article, but men had been sent to hunt for it by coroner J. C. Henry. Dowling had been hired by the base ball management here to pitch for the season, and he and his wife arrived here from Ogden, Utah, on June 4, on which day he pitched his first game for La Grande against Walla Walla. An inquest will be held by coroner Henry today.

Names Kept Secret

Chicago, July 1.—The Federal Grand Jury, which has been investigating the alleged beef trust, completed its work this morning and adjourned until two o'clock this afternoon, when the indictments will be returned. District attorney Morrison says that no names will be made public until the defendants have been arrested and furnished bonds. The attorneys for the packers were in and out of the district attorney's office this morning, supposedly making arrangements for furnishing bonds for their principals. It is reported that the indictments will include practically all of the heads of the various packing companies.

Quite A Payroll

The local branch of the Pacific States Telephone and Telegraph Co. is and has been the scene of much activity for several months, and it is expected that the improvements will all have been completed within another thirty days. At the present time fifteen persons are on the payroll and when thoroughly installed the services of thirteen will be required to keep the La Grande system in working order. This means a monthly payroll of about \$500 or \$600 per annum.
