MANY BODIES ARE RECOVERED

(Scripps News Association) Mexico City July 6th.—Of the bodies wrecked in the Guadalupe flood, one hundred and seventy four more are being taken from the debris. The peculiarity about the flood was that most of the victims were not local who were caught in the flood. On recovering the bodies, the friends of the dead carried them across the mountains without reporting the deaths to the authorities.

The victims are all foreigners. The cause of their death was explosion of a quantity of dynamite which was being unexploded in the Observer as the mayor signs it.
