Gen. Porter Sails (By Scripps News Association) Paris, July 7.—General Horace Porter left for Cherbourg today and will sail for New York this evening. He will sail on the steamer Deutschland. A large number of friends and officials accompanied the general to the train.

TAFT INSPECTS FORTIFICATIONS

(By Scripps News Association) San Francisco, July 7.—Secretary of War Taft this morning made an inspection of the fortifications that guard the port of San Francisco. He was received with full honors at each fort. The troops were lined up and salutes were fired. After luncheon he went to Berkeley where he delivered an address in the Greek University of California. Miss Roosevelt spent the morning in her apartments and this afternoon will take a ride in an automobile.

CONVICTS ARE NOW LOCATED

(Later) Four of the convicts have been sighted on Vashon Island and a posse is in close pursuit and a capture is expected this afternoon. One of the two Japanese who escaped from the prison was seen on the beach near Tacoma this afternoon. A posse is now pursuing him.

Crew Probably Lost (By Scripps News Association) Bizerta Tunis, July 7.—The sailors entombed in the submarine Farfadet, have ceased to respond to the signals of Devore, and it is feared that all have perished. The third and fourth attempts to raise the vessel have failed.

Can Play Ball Pittsburg, July 7.—Judge Weiss today dissolved the temporary injunction granted by the county court restraining Pitcher Wilke and Outfielder Hayden from playing with the Tri-State League. The two players jumped their Baltimore contracts.

Declares Boycott (Scripps News Association) Lincoln, July 7.—As a result of the refusal of the Burlington to pay the tax assessed last year and securing an injunction against collection, commissioners of Seward county have declared a boycott and refuse to ship county supplies over the road. Other counties are preparing to boycott. The Union Pacific has also refused to pay taxes and has joined hands with the Burlington. The deferred payments amount to over half a million dollars, and the county finances are suffering on account thereof. This morning the governor is considering the advisability of calling an extra session of the Legislature to frame a freight and railway bill as a punitive measure.

Still In The Dark

Tacoma July 7—At midnight Marshal Hopkins who is hunting the escaped prisoners from McNeil's island, returned from a search of Ketrone island where he reported the convicts spent the night, but no clue was found. Several reported clues were run down during the day but without result and tonight the officers are in the dark as to the whereabouts of the morning escape. A marine of the US cruiser Obatanago, by the name of Rogers, died here today. He will be given a public funeral.

A Record Run

Salt Lake City July 7.—General Manager E E Calvin of the Southern Pacific arrived at 10:30 Wednesday morning in a special train which broke all records of the Southern Pacific for speed. The run from Ogden to Salt Lake, 37 miles, over the Oregon Short Line tracks, was made in 35 minutes. The entire run, from Sparks, Nev., to Ogden, was made in very fast time, a speed of 91 miles an hour being attained at times. Mr Calvin came to the bed side of his daughter, who has been operated on for appendicitis, but is now recovering.

First Conviction

Pendleton July 7—Wesley Dodson, convicted of living with Belle Roberts, and accepting her earnings, was sentenced to two years in the penitentiary yesterday, by Judge Ellis. A motion for a new trial was denied by the court.

Saves Playmate

Pendleton July 6—Presence of mind displayed by Burney Robinson, yesterday afternoon, probably saved the life of his playmate, Jule Anderson. Anderson who is the son of Conductor Martin Anderson, was firing firecrackers near the north end of the Main street bridge, when his clothes caught on fire from the explosives. Robinson was with the Anderson boy at the time, and seeing that the flames could not be extinguished any other way he quickly grabbed his playmate and dragged him about thirty feet down the bank to the river's edge and shoved him into the water. The stream is shallow at that point and the water did not cover the body of young Anderson, so Robinson plunged into the river and turned his friend over several times, effectually quenching the flames.—Pendleton Tribune.

GERMANS ASK FOR STATEMENT

(By Scripps News Association) Berlin July 7.—The insurance department of the German Government has demanded of the Equitable Mutual of New York that they declare by August 1st in what manner if they propose separating their premium reserves on the German policies from the general reserve and how they intend to invest them. The amount affecting the two companies is about thirteen million dollars.

Judgement Awarded (Scripps News Association) Helena July 7.—The jury in the Federal Court today awarded a judgement in the sum of one hundred and ninety five thousand dollars for the complainants in the case of the St Louis Mining and Milling Company against the Montana Company, limited. The defendants were accused of taking ore illegally, and are owners of the famous 'Drummond Mine'. Rothschild is the principal stockholder.
