### ORDINANCE NO. 309

SERIES OF 1905

An ordinance regulating the use of sidewalks in the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, and to repeal ordinance No 82, series 1889, approved March 28, 1889, and entitled, "An ordinance regulating the use of sidewalks in the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon."

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:—

Section One. No person shall ride any bicycle on any sidewalk within the present established fire limits of the City of La Grande, Oregon.

Section Two. Before riding any bicycle upon any sidewalk not within the fire limits of said City, the rider shall provide and securely attach to such bicycle a good and sufficient bell or other alarm to foot passengers or other persons properly upon or traveling upon said sidewalks, such bell or alarm to be approved by the Marshal of said City.

Section Three. Before riding any bicycle upon any sidewalk not within the fire limits in said City of La Grande, there shall be provided and securely attached to such bicycle on the front part thereof, a good and sufficient lamp, which, between sundown and sunrise, while said bicycle is in use upon such sidewalks in said City, shall be kept lighted, so that the light therein can be readily seen and distinguished at a distance of not less than 300 feet.

Section Four. Any person riding any bicycle upon any of said sidewalks of said City, shall, when meeting or overtaking any person, sound such alarm and dismount from such bicycle, and in no manner disturb, interfere with, or embarrass the free use of said sidewalk by any person or persons lawfully thereon.

Section Five. No person shall use or obstruct the use of any sidewalk in said City by placing or causing to be placed thereon any dirt, litter, building material or other obstructions, or suffer the same to remain after being notified by the City Marshal to remove the same.

Section Six. Section Five of this ordinance shall not be held to prohibit the temporary use of any sidewalk in said city while the premises adjacent thereto are being repaired or buildings erected thereon, or to prohibit the temporary use thereof for the purpose of loading or unloading goods, wares or merchandise, provided always, that such use of obstruction of said sidewalk shall be removed upon the completion of such repairs or buildings and when a reasonable time has elapsed for the completion of such repairs or buildings.

Section Seven. Any person violating the provisions or any provision of this ordinance upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$25, together with costs of such conviction. And in default of the payment of such fine or costs the person so convicted shall be confined in the city jail of said city, until such fine and costs are paid, and not to exceed one day for each \$2 of such fine.

Section Eight. Ordinance No. 82, series 1889, approved March 28th, 1889 and the whole thereof and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section Nine. This ordinance shall be published in the Evening Observer for one issue thereof, and shall be in

full force and effect from and after the 15th day of July, 1905.

Passed by the Council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of July, 1905, by 5 members voting therefor.

### ORDINANCE NO. 310

SERIES 1905

An ordinance to authorize the sprinkling of the streets of the City of La Grande, Oregon.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section One. The street committee of the Council of the City of La Grande, shall have power to contract for, and have sprinkled at the expense of the City of La Grande, such streets in said city as said committee in any contract for the sprinkling thereof, shall designate.

Section Two. This ordinance shall be published in the Evening Observer for one issue thereof, and shall be in full force and effect from and after the 10th day of July, A. D., 1905.

Passed by the Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, July 5, 1905, by 5 members voting therefor.

### ORDINANCE NO. 311

Series of 1905

An ordinance to provide for, and prescribing the compensation of Deputy Marshals for the city of La Grande, Union County, Oregon.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section One. That the city council may, by and with the consent of the Mayor, appoint Deputy Marshals for said city.

Section Two. That the compensation of each of such Deputy Marshals so appointed shall be \$75 00 per month, payable in warrants of said city, drawn on the general fund.

Section Three. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with either section one, or section two of this ordinance, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section Four. This ordinance shall be published in the La Grande Evening Observer for one issue thereof, and be in full force and effect from and after the 11th day of July, 1905.

Passed by the council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of July, 1905, five members voting therefor.

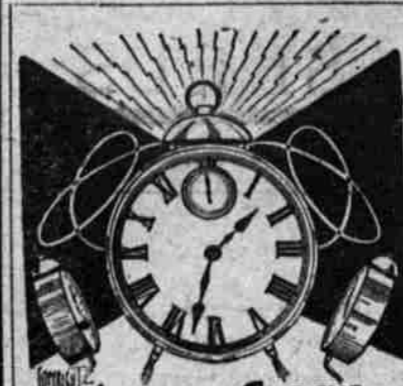
