Either Colonel Clowry must resign or Jacob Schiff will resign from the directorate if it is proved that officials of the company have knowingly sought and maintained relations with poolroom interests.

An investigation has been ordered by Mr Schiff and there will be no hitewash for even the highest official in the company if he has been guilty of breaking the agreement of a year ago that the Western Union would not lease a wire for poolroom privileges.
