FOOD AND DAIRY MEET

Portland, July 11.—The National Food and Dairy convention held its first session yesterday afternoon at 1 o'clock in the Auditorium at the exposition grounds. About 100 delegates listened to addresses of welcome until they must have believed the exposition was their own.

President W. W. P. McConnell of Minnesota presided, and in calling the meeting to order introduced J. W. Bailey of the dairy and food department of Oregon. Mr. Bailey extended a cordial welcome on behalf of the department he represents, and was followed by Mayor Lane, who told the delegates that the city of Portland and all its possessions were open to them.

President Goode of the exposition followed and expressed his delight that the national convention should have selected Portland as its meeting place. Response was made by J. V. Noble of Connecticut on behalf of the association.

WIFE SEES HIS LIFE TAKEN

Philadelphia, July 11.—Silas McDonald, who was for years cashier of the State National bank of Oshkosh, Wis., and who came to this city after that institution went into liquidation, committed suicide today by cutting his throat in the presence of his wife. He had been in ill health. His wife was severely cut in attempting to prevent him from committing suicide.

Missouri Day

Portland, Ore., July 11.—September 11 has finally been decided upon as the date for Missouri day at the Lewis and Clark exposition. A message has been received by the Missouri commission from Governor Folk stating that he will be present on that day. Elaborate plans are being made for the entertainment of Governor Folk. A banquet to which exposition officials and many other prominent western men will be invited, is being planned for the evening.

An Heiress Found

Spokane July 11.—In the person of Louise Colotchi a former inmate of the Main building, the Spokane police last week unearthed an heiress to a \$150,000 fortune in San Francisco. When found by the police the girl was ill in bed in a rooming house on Sprague avenue, near Stevens street, and was living off the bounty of others.

Back of the finding of Louise Colotchi there lies the history of a romantic hot-headed young girl with her own ideas of love, and a stern and practical Italian father. The girl had her way, but was disinherited.

Louise Colotchi fell in with bad companions and the old drama was enacted again. When she came to Spokane she was but one of a hundred women with whom the police deal. One night last winter an acquaintance from San Francisco passing through the Main building recognized her. That night she attempted to commit suicide, but was foiled.

Last week the Spokane police received word from San Francisco to look up Louise Colotchi, as her father was in feeble health and wanted her to return home. The episode incident recalled her to Sergeant Sullivan, and she was located by him.

The girl will leave for San Francisco as soon as she is able to travel. The information from San Francisco stated that in his will her father had left her with her two brothers to share equally in his \$150,000 estate.

A Gold Brick

Seattle, Wash., July 11.—J. J. Underwood has arrived from Nome on the steamer Zealandia with the Alaska exhibit for the Lewis and Clark exposition at Portland. The value of the exhibit of which Mr. Underwood will have charge is over \$50,000, and the two principal features are a \$25,000 gold brick and \$10,000 worth of nuggets from the Peterson cleanup on the Portland bench claim.

In addition to the display of gold, Mr. Underwood has a fine collection of tin, galena, coal, copper, talc and free milling gold ores, plaser tin, furs, ivory, flowers and birds, all native of the Alaska country.
