**CIGARETTE SMOKER

Lafayette, Ind., July 11.—Edward Hammel, traveling salesman for a medicine company, who has been convicted of smoking cigarettes, is serving a sentence of 29 days in default of payment at a fine of \$25 and costs assessed by Judge Foster of Otterbein, will in all probability be compelled to serve the entire sentence.

Fames Pathway

One effect of the action taken by Norway will be to deprive King Oscar of a considerable part of his civil list. Hitherto he has received about 73,000 pounds sterling annually from Sweden and about 27,000 pounds sterling from Norway.

There is a story of those three discussing anxiously whether they had not better throw up England altogether and seek fortune in India or one of the colonies. Luckily they decided to give fortune another chance with very notable results. Mr. Gailly ended as speaker of the house of commons; another became lord chancellor the third died when lord chief justice.

Train Runs Into Field

Greencastle Ind., July 11.—While running at the rate of 80 miles an hour this evening eastbound New York fast mail train on the Big Four collided with the westbound freight, No. 99 which was pulling into a siding at Oakliff, five miles west of here. Fireman Tippy, aged 40, of Indianapolis was fatally, and Engineer A. M. Carner of Mattoon, was seriously injured. Both of the injured were on the mail train. The engine, one mail car and the combination car left the track and ran 50 feet into a corn field.

Teachers Wanted

Pendleton Ore July 11.—Teachers for Umatilla county schools this year are very hard to find, according to the statement of County Superintendent Welles. Many schools in the county as yet are without teachers for the coming year, although the directors offer good salaries. There are many first-class teachers who have not applied for schools this year.

Millionaire Suicides

Chicago, July 11.—Leaving a note to his octogenarian wife to "be good to John and Mary," Lewis B. Stone, a millionaire aged 88 years, committed suicide yesterday morning by shooting himself in his Michigan avenue home. Long continued ill health was the cause. Stone retired in a jovial frame of mind but could not sleep. Nervous and despondent he arose and went down stairs. A few minutes later a shot was heard, and when the members of the family reached the library they found the aged man dying with a bullet wound in his head.
