EVIDENCE AGAINST THE STANDARD OIL

Kansas City, Mo., July 13. In the earlier proceedings against the Standard Oil Company et al today, Henry Whalen, a former employee of the Republic Oil Company, testified that the statements of the concern were made up at Cleveland, and that the oil came from the Standard Oil Company's refinery at Whiting. The witness said that he received orders to raise or lower the price of oil from the local manager of the Standard Oil Company. He also stated that the salesman were instructed not to fight the Standard but the independent concern.

MORE EVIDENCE
A G Shiers, former assistant manager of the Republic Oil company in Kansas City today testified that rebates were given to twenty five customers for about six months, and that the rebates would run from six to forty dollars to new customers whose trade was sought. He testified that The Republican and the Standard transferred oil to each other and borrowed each other's horses. The next hearing will be at Joplin, Mo.

LAWSON IS MET BY GOVERNOR

He spoke informally at the Minneapolis Commercial Club where he said "It is dollars in the East and men in the West, white men", and this was the summary of his tour.

IDENTITY IS STILL UNKNOWN

The crowd in the anti room of the prefecture set upon the assassin, who was dragged into the street and terribly beaten.

CHAUNCY STILL HOLDS THE JOB

Hanged At Salem

Salem July 13—G W Lauth aged twenty-three, was hanged at noon in the penitentiary for the murder of his mistress, Mrs. Leonora B Jones, in Oregon City in last September. Jealousy was the cause of his crime.

Steal Jewels

Newport, R. I., July 12.—When Mrs. Charles Oelrichs returned to her cottage here tonight, after an absence of two hours, she discovered that jewelry valued at \$10,000 had been taken from her dressing case. The Newport police were notified of the robbery. Among the articles lost are a tiara of diamonds and several strings of pearls.

During the period of Mrs. Oelrichs' absence three servants were the only known occupants of the house. The jewels with their paste duplicates, lay on a dressing case in Mrs. Oelrichs' chamber. The imitation jewels were not taken.

Detective Killed

Winfield Kan July 13—O S Calhoun a Santa Fe railway detective, was shot and instantly killed at Cedarville yesterday by two outlaws. Citizens who pursued the outlaws surrounded them near the Oklahoma border and both were shot down, Ed Madigan of Ponca City Okla., being killed and the other outlaw, William Chadburn of this city, fatally injured. The outlaws exchanged shots with the pursuers and during the fight J M Pope a merchant, was shot through the foot, and a woman named Malone was struck in the leg by a stray bullet.

Madigan and Chadburn held up and robbed six traveling men in a hotel here Sunday. Detective Calhoun located the men and after securing the assistance of the town marshal and one of the traveling men who was robbed by the outlaws, went to arrest them. The outlaws opened fire on the officers, shooting Calhoun through the heart. They stole two horses and fled toward Hewins, seven miles distant. Warning was sent to the deputy sheriff at Hewins, who gathered a score of citizens, armed them and posted them at advantageous positions. The outlaws rode into Hewins, purchased a rifle and revolver at a hardware store and started off on a gallop when the posse opened fire on them from the protection of store buildings. The robbers returned the fire and continued firing until both were shot from their horses. Miss Malone was shot when she ran out to see what the trouble was.

Japan's Demands

Victoria B C July 13—Mail advice received by the Empress of India today include views of Tokio political parties and politicians of Japan with regard to peace terms to be sought by Japan. The seven professors, headed by Dr Tomisu, which have become notorious for their jingoism, have announced a policy calling for the cession of all the territory of Manchuria and Siberia to lake Baikal and an indemnity of one and a half billion of dollars, but their views are not taken seriously by the Japanese press.

The terms proposed by the progressive party are the cession of Sakhalin, acquisition of fishing rights on the Siberian coast, opening of the port of Vladivostok, acquisition of the Chinese Eastern railway by Japan, the inheritance of all rights of Russia in Manchuria by Japan and an indemnity of a billion dollars.

Viscount Aoki, expressing his views in the Chuwo, says that although there is a general desire that Japan should obtain the Siberian coast province and Vladivostok, it is unlikely that the hope will be realized, as these territories have not yet been touched by the Japanese.

Fairfax S D July 13—One was killed and fourteen were injured by a cyclone which swept a portion of the Rosebud reservation today. Roy McFadden was killed near St Elmo and eight were injured at Herlock. Several buildings were destroyed at Burke, six were injured and two may die.

Notice To Water Consumers

All persons knowing themselves to be in arrears for city water are hereby notified to call at the office of the city Recorder and settle at once. In order that there may be no mis understanding we cite the customer to the following section of the city ordinance. This ordinance will be enforced.

Section 28—The water rates shall be payable in advance at the office of the water superintendent on the first day of each month (except for meters which are payable on the first day of the succeeding month), and if not paid within the first ten days the water will be shut off the premises, as provided in Sections 26 and 27.

Later ordinance provides that water rates shall be payable to City Recorder instead of Water Superintendent.
