**Negotiate For Lands**

Eugene Oct 14—It is reported that the Cooperative Christian Federation of Oregon is negotiating the purchase of more than 2,000,000 acres of land involving an outlay of \$8,000,000. The deal includes the Lazare Kress land grant; a strip 12 miles wide extending from the Willamette valley to the eastern Oregon line; the Pengra land grant, a similar strip extending across the state, and the mills and lands of the Booth-Kelly Lumber company. It is said the first model city of the federation will be erected near the western end of these lands, and that a railroad will be built through central Oregon and extended down the Willamette valley to Portland. The report says the federation has also approached A. B. Hammond for purchase of the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, which Hammond holds at a valuation of \$1,000,000.

**Arrested in Salem**

On last Tuesday the Sheriff of Marion county, Oregon, upon separate indictments found by the Marion county grand jury three months ago, arrested A. T. Kellher, a prominent citizen of this city, and Justice of the Peace, H. H. Turner upon a charge of forgery. The indictments were found in connection with the land frauds in this county. Kellher, who is regarded as a principal in extensive land dealings, has just returned from Chicago. Kellher is alleged to have purchased hundreds of thousands of acres of timber land from the state under fraudulent applications which he sold to eastern capitalists. Turner, it is charged, is involved in the transactions to the extent of having attested to a great number of alleged forged signatures to the applications and assignments of certificates. More arrests are expected to follow.

**Sportsman Mangled**

Fresno Cal July 14—A Southern Pacific switch engine, driving three cars, yesterday ran over and dragged 30 feet William Zibell, one of the best known trotting horse drivers on the coast, and B. S. McMahon of the editorial staff of the San Francisco Breeder and Sportsman, both of San Francisco. McMahon was instantly killed, the body being badly mangled. Zibell lost both hands, one foot, has one arm broken in several places, his shoulder crushed and suffered internal injuries. He will probably die.

**Trample Old Glory**

London, Ontario, July 14.—An American flag was torn down in front of the city hall yesterday and trampled under a hundred feet as the result of a remark made by an American visitor at the Orangemen's demonstration.

About 800 Americans came over from Michigan and during the day carried the Stars and Stripes through the streets without unfavorable comment being elicited. Tonight the Americans gathered in front of a hotel, when someone cried: "To hell with Canada, she never showed us yet." Instantly the American flag owned by the Port Huron (Michigan) lodge was torn from where it waved in the breeze and was ripped into shreds and trampled under the feet of an angry mob.

Port Huron Orangemen say they did not resent it as they believed the insult to Canada was uncalled for.

**Hood River Fire**

Hood River, Or., July 14—Sparks from the engine room destroyed the mill of the Davenport Brothers Lumber Company shortly after 12 o'clock Wednesday night. The loss is \$27,000, with no insurance. Two hundred men are thrown out of employment. The firm will rebuild the mill.
