NOTED GENERAL IS DEAD

Boise July 17—General Wilmon W Blackmar of Boston, commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, who arrived in Boise on the evening of July 10 in the course of a western tour which was expected to include a trip to Alaska, died at the Idanha hotel at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Death was due to interstitial nephritis.

General Blackmar was ill when he reached Boise accompanied by Mrs Blackmar and the latter's sister, and he had to have assistance in getting from the train to the hotel. Dr E E Maxey was called to attend him and it was found he was suffering from this disease. It was believed that the hardships of the trip westward from Boston with the many stops and appointments that had to be made, had overtaxed his strength, but it was hoped at the time that with a few days' rest the aged veteran would recover his health and strength. The gravity of the case was not made known to the public, this being the wish of Mrs Blackmar.

BIOGRAPHICAL

General Blackmar was born in Bristol Pa., on July 26, 1841, but spent the greater part of his life in Massachusetts. He was a lawyer by profession, but gave up active practice some years ago. While a student at Exeter N H, at the time of the breaking out of the civil war, he enlisted in the Fifteenth Pennsylvania cavalry. He served with distinction in the army and was awarded a medal of honor by congress for gallant action in the field of Five Forks. He was promoted to a captaincy as a result of his conduct on that occasion.

Later General Blackmar was judge advocate of Massachusetts for a number of years on the staff of Governor John D Long, Thomas Talbot and Alexander Rice. He was elected commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic at the time of the last national encampment in Boston in August of last year.

The remains will be shipped to Boston for interment.

HAS CHARGE OF REMAINS

Boise, Idaho, July 17.—The Phil Sheridan Post, G A R, at Boise, has taken charge of the remains of General Blackmar. The body was embalmed and encased in a metallic casket, which was conveyed to the Grand Army Hall, where it will lay in state until three o'clock this afternoon. At that time it will be taken to the depot. Mrs. Blackmar will leave with the remains tonight for Boston.

OFFICER TO EXUME THE DEAD BODY

New York July 17—The supreme court this afternoon gave district attorney Clark, of Brooklyn, authority to exume the body of Mrs Carlton, the second wife of E E Carlton now in jail charged with swindling and an attempt at poisoning Mrs Carlton who died of lockjaw, as had the first wife of Carlton. The relatives of the deceased woman charge that Carlton executed a diabolical plan of innoculating the woman with tenanic bacilli. Both of the women were insured in Carlton's favor.

Moving Power Plant

The Grande Ronde Electric Company is having its power house moved six hundred feet down the hill from its former position below Morgan Lake. This building is thirty feet square and was originally erected six hundred feet below the lake by the La Grande Water Storage Company, where they intended cutting the power. However, after the consolidation of the original Morgan Lake company with the Cove power company and the La Grande Electric Light and Power company, it was deemed advisable to have the power generated twelve hundred feet below the lake. The contract for moving the building was let to Mr John Hough, the house-mover. All of the machinery for the power plant is already here, with the exception of the large wheel, and it is stated on good authority that the plant will be in operation within sixty days. The location of the plant will be on Mill creek, near the place where the city formerly took out water.

Quick Work

Marshall Rayburn did some quick work today in arresting an alleged forger. About eleven o'clock this morning he received a telephone message from the sheriff at Vale, Oregon telling him to look out for a man by the name of August Ball, and if found, to arrest him on a charge of forgery. Inside an hour and a half from the time the marshal received this notification, the said August Ball was confined behind the bars of the city jail. From what Marshal Rayburn could learn in regard to the matter from talking the short time, the man is alleged to have made too free use of other people's names in signing them to checks. The sheriff from Malheur county will arrive after the prisoner tonight.
