FLOUR TO CHINA FROM U. S.

For the eleven months ending May 1905 there were shipped from the United States to the Chinese Empire 67,111 barrels of wheat flour of the value at port of shipment of \$259,983. But during the same period we exported to Hong Kong, an English port; but for trade purposes may be considered a part of China, 964,865 barrels of wheat flour valued in the U S at \$3,812,262. By adding the flour sent to China proper and to Hong Kong the amount of flour shipped from the U S to China will be found to be 1,031,987 barrels valued in the U S at \$4,072,245. It took 4,643,892 bushels of wheat to make the flour we sent to China during the eleven months ending with May 1905.

Our total shipment of wheat flour during the eleven months ending with May 1905 amounted to 8,245,460 barrels at \$37,472,001. The above figure, which are taken by the Observer from the Monthly Summary of Commerce and Labor, for May 1905 received at this office yesterday, show that China for the period mentioned, purchased, from us one eighth of the wheat flour we exported.

LAW NOT FOR CHIEFS

There seems to be a fixed belief among chiefs of savage tribes that laws are made to assist them in governing their tribes in ways that suits their personal ideas what best serves them, and that they as chiefs are in no wise amenable to law, for laws, rules or customs are not made to regulate or abridge their conduct. Some years ago William Barnhart, Indian agent at Umetilla was lecturing a chief for bringing a jug of whiskey on the reservation and getting drunk. The chief replied "I know there is a law saying that Indians shall not purchase whiskey or get drunk but that law does not apply to me I am a chief and can do as I please". him "that he must obey the law or he would put him in jail and make him work, that laws were made to be obeyed by chiefs as well as common Indians."

White chiefs in the United States seem to entertain the same ideas as Mehoit, the Indian chief held and they and their friends get very mad when the United States grand juries tell them that they are as amenable to the laws as common people; and the common people seem very much surprised when trial juries convict men who have long played the role as white chief.
