Aged Indian Killed

Everett July 19—The dead body of Doctor Jim, an Indian aged 106 years was found under a bridge on the Darrington branch of the Northern Pacific, three miles from Arlington today, with a bullet hole in the back of the head. He disappeared Monday. The trail indicated that he was dragged fifty feet from the point on the bank of the Stillaguamish where it is believed he was sitting when shot.
