One Cent Postal Route

Washington July 22-Auditor Me-Jardy of the postoffice department, today signed the smallest government warrant ever issued in payment of services actually rendered. It was for one cent and will pay for the delivery of mail over a postal route in New Hampshire for a period of four years.

The warrant was made to the orde of Adriel L Stuart of Fredom, N H who was the lowest bidder for the contract for carrying mail from that town to a village seven and one half miles distant.
