**MORE BUSINESS  
ABOUT THE ROAD**

Superintendent Campbell, of this  
division of the O. R. & N., arrived in  
the city this morning in his special  
car attached to No 6. He left immedi-  
ately afterwards on the branch road  
for Elgin. When interviewed by an  
Observer reporter, and asked as to the  
purpose of his visit to Elgin and to  
the intent of the road in building he  
said:—"I am going to Elgin for the  
purpose of attending to matters regard-  
ing the right of way of the O R & N.  
When the company has rights, they  
always look after them and do not per-  
mit their violation. As to the matter  
of building the road, I can say nothing  
further than that Superintendent  
O'Brien has given it out that the road  
will be built through to the Wallows.  
At what time the construction work  
will begin, I do not know and can not  
state."

**Moody Explains**

Nahant Mass., July 24—Attorney  
General W H Moody in an address be-  
fore the Lincoln club of Boston at its  
midsummer outing here Saturday, gave  
a resume of the government's proceed-  
ings against the combination of beef  
packers. The attorney general said  
his conclusion to review the situation  
was due to the not unnatural misunder-  
standing as to the attitude of the ad-  
ministration. He also said that he  
spoke with the full approval of the  
president. There had been occasional  
complaint, he said, that he had with-  
held facts which the people have a  
right to know, but he insisted that  
much of the work of his department  
could only be efficient when it was  
done quietly and in secret. When he  
had drawn the line between facts which  
ought to be confided to the public and  
those which for the time being ought  
to be withheld in the interest of public  
justice, he had acted solely in the pub-  
lic interests.

The attorney general then went into  
a complete review of the case, begin-  
ning with the action of Attorney Gen-  
eral Knox in May, 1902, when he filed  
a bill of equity in the United States  
circuit court at Chicago charging seven  
corporations, one co-partnership and  
23 individuals with conspiracy to sup-  
press competition. A demurrer of de-  
fendants to this bill was overruled in  
February, 1903, in an opinion by Judge  
Grosscup. In the following May an in-  
junction was issued against all the de-  
fendants forbidding a continuance of  
the conspiracy alleged in the bill. The  
defendants appealed to the federal  
supreme court, which unanimously up-  
held the position of the government  
and the decision of the circuit court.
