JAPAN GRATEFUL TO AMERICA

Tokio, July 25.—The Hochi, Conn Okuma's newspaper organ, tomorrow will publish a leading article welcoming the Taft party and gratefully recalling that the United States has been to the Japanese since the time of Commodore Perry, an unerring guide and friend. The policy of the United States toward Japan, the article will say, has been an unbroken record of kindly assistance, politically and commercially. In fact in all departments of the progress of modern Japan, America's help is clearly traced.

Especially President Roosevelt's successful endeavor in bringing the peace plenipotentiaries together adds a memorable chapter to the already magnificent record of America's invaluable aid to Japan.

Daring Japs

London July 25.—The correspondent of the Daily Telegraph at Tokio forwards a dispatch from the Japanese correspondent of that paper at Moji, Japan, telling of a daring reconnaissance of a Japanese squadron in Possiet bay on July 14. Three days later the Japanese vessels occupied Kusanpan, where there is a vast and splendid harbor. Some of the vessels, the correspondent says, ran right inside Possiet bay, which is of great strategic value.

Venezuelan Dead

Caracas Venezuelan July 25.—Dr Juan Pablo Rojas Paul, former president of Venezuela, died yesterday. He was born in 1845.

Dr Rojas Paul was president of Venezuela from February 23, 1888, to February 20, 1890.

Dan Lamont Dead

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., July 25.—Daniel Scott Lamont, secretary of war during the second administration of President Cleveland, died suddenly at his home at Millbrook, Dutchess county, Sunday night at 9:15 o'clock. Heart failure was the cause of death.

Mr. Lamont was vice president of the Northern Pacific railroad and a director and trustee in many railroad and financial corporations. He leaves a widow and two daughters.

Russia's Plan

Berlin July 25.—The Local Anzeiger today says:

"Russia may propose to Japan to take over all her foreign war loans in lieu of indemnity. M. Witte's interviews in Paris are connected with such a plan and the visit of Herr Ernst von Mendelssohn, head of Russia's principal bankers and to Berlin to Chancellor von Buelow is supposed to be on the same basis."

Chinese Immigration

Washington July 25.—Reports from the immigration bureau for the month of June show that during that month over 10,000 Chinese applied for admittance and nearly 8000 were admitted.
