Portland, Ore., July 26 .- In pronouncing sentence upon the aged United State a Senator John H Mitchell yesterday, Judge Delfaven said: "The statute under which the in fice Phone 1864 distment was found provides that the offense shall be punished by imprison ment of not more than two years or by a fine of not more than \$10,000. It also renders the defendant incapable Miles Phone 214 of again holding any office of trust or profit in the United States. As I construe the language of the statute the punishment must be both fine and im prisonment, but the court is given great intitude in fixing the amount. of fine or imprisonment. The court may nake the publishment merely nominal. In pronouncing jadgment it is not my purpose to comment upon the evidence or the verdict found by the jury. 




