**FORCED TO  
HER DEATH**

Portland, Ore., July 25.—Operated on against her will for a cleft palate by an eminent specialist before the Lewis and Clark dental congress, Miss Elsie Larson, a talented Portland young woman, is dead from the shock. The length of time she was under the influence of chloroform weakened her heart and she expired Sunday at Good Samaritan hospital.

Miss Larson was an accomplished pianist and violinist. Contrary to her wishes, her parents insisted that she undergo an operation for the cure of her affliction. Dr. G. V. I. Brown, a specialist from Cincinnati, undertook to demonstrate the operation before the dental congress. It was apparently successful, but the patient never rallied. Dr. Brown says the highly nervous condition of the patient was responsible for her death. Miss Larson was a daughter of Rev. C. J. Larsen pastor of the Norwegian Evangelical church. She was 23 years old.

**Oregon Crop Reports**

The United States Department of Agriculture in its report from the weather bureau for the state of Oregon, for the week ending Monday, July 24, has the following general summary:

The past week was the hottest of the season, and no rain of consequence occurred in any part of the State. Fortunately, the wind was generally light and the crops suffered but little damage. In the Grande Ronde valley and in some of the Columbia River counties east of the Cascade Mountains late sown spring wheat was damaged by the hot weather and will probably be cut for hay. The bulk of the crop, however, is safe, and both spring and fall wheat are now being cut as rapidly as possible. Threshing will begin in the Willamette valley this week. All indications point to an extra good crop of wheat, both as to quantity and quality.

Pasture is getting short, but stock continues in good condition. The flow of milk is decreasing in the dairy districts, but not more than usual at this season of the year. The second crop of alfalfa is being cut, and the crop promises to be about an average one. Hop bugs are forming and the vines are growing nicely. Hop lice are still to be found, but they are less numerous than formerly. Corn, potatoes and gardens have made good advancement, but these crops would be improved by more rain. Early apples are ripe. Prunes, pears and peaches are doing well.

**Deserter Happy**

Honolulu, July 25.—G. A. Whitlock, who is under arrest here on the charge of having deserted from the gunboat Bennington, claims to have missed the vessel and is congratulating himself on his failure to have not reached the wharf in time. He says that he did not intend to desert.

According to Whitlock, it was common talk among the members of the Bennington's crew that the boilers of the gunboat were unsafe, but he claims that this had nothing to do with his leaving the vessel. Whitlock also says that the chief machinist of the Bennington told him that the boilers of the boat were unsafe.

**Notice To Water Consumers**

All persons knowing themselves to be in arrears for city water are hereby notified to call at the office of the city Recorder and settle at once. In order that there may be no mis understanding we cite the customer to the following section of the city ordinance. This ordinance will be enforced.

Section 28.—The water rates shall be payable in advance at the office of the water superintendent on the first day of each month (except for meters which are payable on the first day of the succeeding month), and if not paid within the first ten days the water will be shut off the premises, as provided in Sections 26 and 27.

Later ordinance provides that water rates shall be payable to City Recorder or instead of Water Superintendent.
