## WILL NOT SIGN AMERICAN TREATY

Washington July 28—Some doubt is expressed in official circles whether it will be possible to obtain China's consent to another treaty with the United States providing for the exclusion of Chinese laborers from this country. The state department is aware of ill feeling throughout China on the whole subject and now that the immigration treaty with China has been allowed to lapse without the negotiation of a new agreement, reports have reached here that China is inclined hereafter to refuse to sign any similar convention. China's position appears to be that the exclusion of the Chinese citizens from a friendly country is in itself a disgrace, and while she cannot ignore the laws of a foreign power providing for such exclusion she can refuse to sanction it or become part of it by concluding a treaty involving such restrictions. A year ago it is said, it would have been easy to conduct negotiations with China for the exclusion of Chinese laborers only now however it is understood the Chinese officials are disposed to regard the signing of such a treaty as beneath the dignity of their government.

## CANADIAN RIFLES ARE BARRED

Montreal, July 28.—The proposed acquisition of the forty-third regiment Duke of Cornwall's rifles of Ottawa, to Providence, R. I., for the purpose of participating in a celebration by the residents of that city, has been abandoned because of difficulties with the authorities of the states through which the regiment would pass. The regiment received permission from the federal authorities of the United States to cross the boundary, but they would not be allowed to carry arms enroute, as the laws of Massachusetts definitely forbid the invasion of the state by an armed body.

## Want New Treaty

Washington, July 28.—Germany's commercial relations with the United States will be among the most important subjects to come before the senate at the next session of congress. Having negotiated new commercial arrangements with Belgium, Italy, Russia, Roumania and Serbia, Germany is anxious to make a similar convention with the United States. The new treaties already concluded become effective March 1 and preliminary notice has been received that the German treaty with this country will be allowed to lapse about November 10. A thorough understanding exists, however, between Washington and Berlin regarding the reasons for ending this treaty.

## RAID ON CHICAGO GAMBLERS

Chicago July 28.—John Collins, the newly installed chief of police of this city started the gambling fraternity tonight by leading a comprehensive raid against the largest poker rooms to be found in the downtown section of the city. Headed by Chief Collins in person, the police descended upon four prominent gambling clubs arrested about 100 men and confiscated large quantities of gambling paraphernalia and destroyed all of the furniture found in the places. Chief Collins announced early in the day that he purposed to suppress all gambling in the city and the raid tonight was the first step taken in that direction.

## 44,000,000 Bushels

Portland, Ore July 29.—As a result of the hot weather of the past five days harvest will be in full blast inside of another week, and estimates made by the O. R. & N. statistician indicate that the wheat yield of the Inland Empire of Oregon, Washington and Northern Idaho this year will approximate 44,000,000 bushels. Harvest has been brought on earlier than usual by the period of very warm weather than prevailed for the past 10 days. Damage has been suffered by spring wheat in the Palouse county estimated at 10 to 15 per cent in the vicinity of Garfield, Oakesdale and St. John. In the Walla Walla valley 90 per cent of the wheat is reported clear before the hot weather set in and the injury sustained was but a small proportion of the crop. In the vicinity of Pendleton conditions are reported with an estimated yield of 40 bushels, and there will be 15 to 20 bushels in the light lands of the foothills where some damage was wrought.
