"Russian Wheat"

A fine sample of Speltz or "Russian wheat" grown on the west side of the Jordan river, is on exhibition in the rooms of the Commercial club. This sample is of special interest here in that last year the management of the club secured two bushels of this wheat from Russia and distributed it to Salt Lake county farmers with a view to local testing. The sample of the result, now being exhibited, was grown in 110 days without a drop of water, and looks very well. If the milling shows up equally well there is no reason why large crops of the Russian wheat should not be grown all along the dry benches of this valley.—Deseret News.
