Sections 6, 7 and 10, township 52 north, range 102 west; sections 3 to 8, 10 to 18, 22, 23, 27, 33 and 34, township 52 north, range 103 west; sections 12 and 13, township 52 north, range 104 west.

Notice To Water Consumers

All persons knowing themselves to be in arrears for city water are hereby notified to call at the office of the city Recorder and settle at once. In order that there may be no misapprehension we cite the customer to the following section of the city ordinance. This ordinance will be in force.

Section 28.—The water rates shall be payable in advance at the office of the water superintendent on the first day of each month (except for meters which are payable on the first day of the succeeding month), and if not paid within the first ten days the water will be shut off the premises, as provided in Sections 26 and 27.

Later ordinance provides that water rates shall be payable to City Recorder instead of Water Superintendent.
