Financiers Preparing

Berlin, July 29—In view of the probability of an early peace between Russia and Japan, the terms of which will involve the payment of a very heavy indemnity by Russia, the financiers of Europe have been holding conferences to the end that the peace indemnity may be paid without seriously disturbing the finances of the world. The Mendelssohns, the Berlin bankers who have been for many years the representatives on the continent of the Russian government and who have negotiated many of the Russian loans, have formed an alliance with the Rothschilds in respect of the matter and have held communications with all the leading financial institutions both on the continent and in England. They are about to send their representatives to New York with a view of enlisting the co-operation of the larger financiers of the United States. It is likely that a Russian loan for the purpose of paying the indemnity will be scattered, and that a considerable portion of it will be taken in the United States. J. Pierpont Morgan, after having conferred with a number of financiers of England is sailing today for New York.
