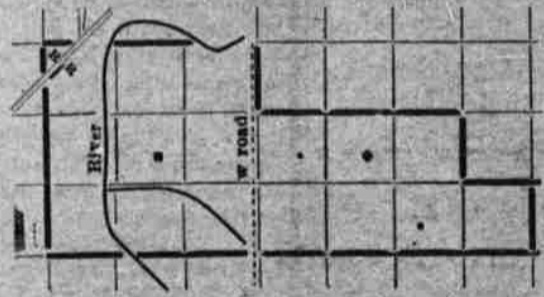

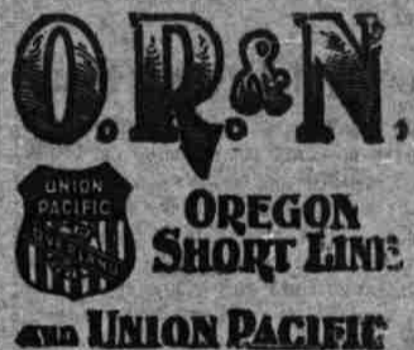
Mr. P. L. Berry, superintendent of bridges for the O. R. & N. is in the city today on business.
