Lard Drawing

Salt Lake Aug 1—Promptly at 9 o'clock this morning the registration of applicants for homestead entries on the Uintah reservation began at Provo Price and Vernal, Utah, and Grand Junction Colo. The drawing will take place at Provo, beginning Aug 17. Those in charge of drawing are Land Commissioner W A Richards, John Dorn of Salt Lake and Irving Howber of Colorado Springs.

More than a thousand strangers already have arrived in Provo to await the registration and drawing, and the city is like a frontier town of half a century ago. Tents cover the court house square and all vacant lots, and scores of prairie schooners are lumbering in from every direction. Full provision has been made for the entertainment of all strangers, and ample police protection will be furnished.

Wants Damages

London Aug 1—In reply to a question in the house of lords last night Lord Lansdowne, foreign secretary said the government had intimated to Russia that claims for compensation to the respective owners and crew of the British steamers Kido and Ikhona which were sunk by Russian auxiliary cruisers after the battle of the sea of Japan, would be pressed irrespective of the findings of the original prize court.

Will Not Talk

New York August 1—The reported interview with M Witte, the Russian plenipotentiary, on board the Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse, published here today, was read at the headquarters of the Japanese peace embassy, but no comment was made. Minister Sato of the commission said that he thought that M Witte was vested with power equal to that of Baron Komura in the matter of negotiating peace.
