## Sustains Richards

Washington, Aug. 1.—According to advices received in Washington, a movement has been started in Salt Lake to bring about the dismissal of William A. Richards, commissioner of the general land office. But like most troubles arising in Salt Lake, the Mormon question is at the bottom, and when Mormonism is injected into a case of this kind, and unfairly so, there is no danger that President Roosevelt will extend comfort to the disgruntled element.

For several weeks Commissioner Richards has been sending out warnings to the public about the lands of the Uintah Indian reservation, soon to be opened. Promoters and persons interested in booming the Uintah lands have been painting glowing pictures of what is to be found there, but representatives of the general land office who have been all over the reservation report the land to be ordinary sagebrush country, very little of it worth settling upon, hardly any of it worth \$1.25 an acre.

Accepting the opinion of these men as correct, Commissioner Richards has warned the public not to expect a garden spot on the Uintah reservation, if they go in and make entries. Naturally he incurred the ill will of the boomers, and they set about to make trouble.

President Roosevelt is himself quite familiar with the situation in Utah; he knows Commissioner Richards well, he admires his fearlessness and his fairness, and will not be misguided by any sensational charges that may come to him from Salt Lake. There is no danger that Commissioner Richards will lose his job. He has done the right thing and the President will sustain him.

## All Not Closed

Memphis Tenn. Aug. 1.—The report given out yesterday following the meeting of the state, county and city boards of health regarding the quarantine regulations established against New Orleans against fever infected districts, proves to be partly erroneous. The official statement is that West Tennessee and Hamilton county will close its doors against the fever districts. No quarantine rules for the entire state have been promulgated. Strict vigilance is being maintained by quarantine officials who are guarding the approaches from the south to this division of the state.

## Anglo-Japanese Treaty

London, Aug. 1.—Considerable progress is making with the new Anglo-Japanese treaty of alliance. Some details have not yet been fully settled, but it can be definitely stated that the terms will be decidedly more comprehensive than those governing the present alliance. The Associated Press learns that the British government's presumption is that its advice will be asked by Japan in the course of the peace negotiations and that it will then gladly offer what counsel may seem to be best calculated to assure permanent peace.

## Notice To Water Consumers

All persons knowing themselves to be in arrears for city water are hereby notified to call at the office of the city Recorder and settle at once. In order that there may be no mis understanding we cite the customer to the following section of the city ordinance. This ordinance will be enforced.

Section 28.—The water rates shall be payable in advance at the office of the water superintendent on the first day of each month (except for meters which are payable on the first day of the succeeding month), and if not paid within the first ten days the water will be shut off the premises, as provided in Sections 26 and 27.

Later ordinance provides that water rates shall be payable to City Recorder instead of Water Superintendent.
