The affray occurred about 11 o'clock on one of the principal business streets of the city. Mrs. Nichols was knocked to the sidewalk and it was necessary to carry her to the office of the nearest physician. It was a case of mistaken identity.

husband ran away with a widow from this city whose husband had been dead but a few weeks. The woman returned here this morning and Mrs. Jones was watching for her.

Mrs. Nichols and the widow resemble each other considerably both as to height and form, and dress somewhat similar.

Mrs. Jones was left with two little children to support by her heartless husband.

American origin. It is the lineal descendant of the Sons of Liberty, the men who founded this great Republic; it was they who were the Boston Tea Party; also the Minute Men at Lexington. In 1833 the Sons of Liberty and the Knights of St. Tamany consolidated and formed the present Improved Order of Redmen.

The Redmen have always had the good of the country at heart, during the rebellion they had many purely Redmen regiments in the field and during the late Spanish-American War there were at least two Redmen regiments in the field notably the two hundred and second New York and sixth Ohio. The motto of this order is Friendship, Freedom and Charity for all. It speaks well of an order when you say that none but honest and industrious men are permitted to enter its portals, and that there is no such thing as a Redman without work providing he wishes it.

The street fair committee is C. J. Rockwell, Chairman; J. B. Gilham, Sec'y; Wm. Ash, Treas; Dr. G. L. Biggers, Jos. McCrary, Frank Brown and A. N. Mayville, Committee on Entertainment. The balance of the lodge has been appointed committee at large. Each and everyone having his duties to perform on specified nights.

Summer Schedule

In connection with this improved service, special round trip season excursion tickets are sold from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points at rate of \$4.00 for the round trip, good for return passage until October 15th.

Special commutation tickets, good for five round trips, are sold from Portland to same points for \$15.00, good to return until October 15th.

Saturday special round trip excursion tickets from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points on sale every Saturday at rate of \$2.50 for round trip, good to return Sunday.

Tickets sold from Portland to North Beach points are issued in connection with the O. E. & N. steamers from Astoria, and baggage is transferred to and from depot and steamer dock at Astoria free of charge, and all tickets sold by the O. E. & N. Co. from Portland to Clatsop and North Beach points, are interchangeable and will be honored on trains of this company in either direction between Portland and Astoria.

Tickets sold at all O. E. & N. stations and passengers wishing to go to points on Clatsop Beach should so specify, in order to avoid confusing this popular resort with that of Long Beach, Wash., which is reached only by boat at Astoria, thus causing delays enroute.

Notice To Water Consumers

All persons knowing themselves to be in arrears for city water are hereby notified to call at the office of the City Recorder and settle at once. In order that there may be no mis understanding we cite the customer to the following section of the city ordinance. This ordinance will be enforced.

Section 28—The water rates shall be payable in advance at the office of the water superintendent on the first day of each month (except for meters which are payable on the first day of the succeeding month), and if not paid within the first ten days the water will be shut off the premises, as provided in Sections 26 and 27.

Later ordinance provides that water rates shall be payable to City Recorder instead of Water Superintendent.
