Grafters in Manila Receive Sentence

Washington Aug. 4.—According to reports received here from Manila with reference to the discovered grafts in the military supply department of which it was stated that the books had been falsified to cover a shortage, covering a period of four years, involving \$100,000 the chief clerk Wm Reeves has been sentenced to fifteen months for selling cases of surgical instruments, stolen from the government. Paul Stangl was sentenced for eighteen months for the same charge and private Strawser and Stone breaker of the hospital service received five year each.

Can Neither Treat, Trade, or Travel

Pendleton, Aug. 4.—There will be little doing in Pendleton next Sunday, for at the meeting of the council last night a Sunday closing ordinance, aiming at the absolute suspension of business on that day, was adopted. In severity the new ordinance goes much further than the state law upon the subject, and is in a class with the "blue laws" of old New England. Not only are all ordinary business houses ordered closed, but livery stables are forbidden to let out their teams and rigs except for funerals, or in cases of mercy or necessity. All pieces of amusements are barred, drug stores are forbidden to sell night but medicine, bakeries anything but bread, and all else is prohibited except the service of undertakers and doctors. No exceptions were made for meat markets or for ice factories, consequently neither may be secured upon the Sabbath day hereafter.
The draft of the Sunday closing ordinance had been prepared during yesterday, as was stated last evening, and when routine business was finished last night was duly presented. On being first read it was ordered referred to the ordinance committee which at once reported favorably upon the law, and it was then passed to its various readings and adopted by a unanimous vote.

Eugene McCoy Drowned

Yesterday afternoon about five o'clock word reached town that Eugene the twelve year old son of Mr and Mrs James McCoy was drowned. Dr Mollitor was summoned and at once went to the river where the accident occurred and though he did all that was in his power to fan a spark of life into the inanimate body, his efforts proved fruitless. The little fellow had been too long in the water.

The story of the drowning is the same one which the news papers are forced to chronicle every season. The little fellow was bathing and got in over his depth, and before assistance could reach him he went down for the third time. The funeral will take place tomorrow morning at ten o'clock at the Catholic church, Rev Father Whyte officiating.

Motor Cars

Pendleton is considering the possibility of new motor cars to be placed on the Harriman and lines is to inaugurate a campaign to have a car placed on the ran between Pendleton and Walla Walla. La Grande might act likewise with reference to the Elgin branch.

SUDDEN DEATH OF A CHILD

All day Tuesday the 4 year old son of W W Weatherspoon, O R & N agent at Pleasant Valley, played as was his custom. In the evening he complained that he did not feel well. His symptoms indicated headache and fever. His condition was not alarming until yesterday morning when he grew rapidly worse and died about 8 o'clock. O M Whitehead dressed the body, incased it in ice and took the remains to Baker City for shipment to Summerville for burial. When the remains arrived in Baker City an autopsy was had and the physician stated the cause of death was appendicitis.

New Masonic Temple

The Masonic grand lodge of Oregon has purchased 100 by 100 feet of ground at the southwest corner of West Park and Yamhill streets, from Fred S Stanley and Robert Smith, for \$25,000, and will erect a Masonic temple on the site, says the Oregon Daily Journal. The old Masonic temple, at the corner of Alder and Third streets, will probably be sold and the proceeds invested in the new temple.
