LA GRANDE MAN HAULS HARRIMAN

Engineer Pete Theisen, in charge of O R & N passenger engine No 192, has gone to Spokane to haul E H Harriman's special from Spokane to Portland by way of Seattle.

General Manager O'Brien, of the O R & N, in hopes of furnishing Mr Harriman with the best possible service while in the Northwest, sent this special engine in charge of one of the oldest engineers on the system to pull the special.

Engine 192 was given right of track over everything from La Grande to Spokane and made a phenomenal run to that place to meet the Harriman train there today.

From Spokane Engineer Theisen will be accompanied by an engineer from the Great Northern who is familiar with that road, to assure the absolute safety of the train while passing over the Spokane-Seattle division from Seattle to Portland an engineer from the Northern Pacific will accompany Engineer Theisen to pilot him over that road which is not familiar to the O R & N engineer.

The trip to be made by Mr Theisen and his engine will amount to 1000 miles when he returns to La Grande after delivering the special into the keeping of the Southern Pacific at Portland.

The Harriman special is made up of five elegant coaches, and bears E H Harriman, president of the Harriman system, and a large party of officials and eastern capitalists, who are on a tour of the Harriman lines. Mr Harriman will sail from either San Francisco or Victoria, B.C., for the Orient next week, after inspecting the system through Oregon and California.

He will visit Japan, Manchuria, the Philippines and China, in the interest of the traffic carried by Harriman steamers from Pacific coast points to the Orient.

MANY HUNTERS' LICENSES ISSUED

County Clerk J B Gilham reports that 170 hunters' licenses have been issued from his office to date, preparatory to the opening of the grouse season on August 15. This number will be greatly swelled as the time for the open season draws nearer, as many have not yet complied with the law.

Few infringements of the law in regard to grouse hunting are reported and little shooting has been noticed in the vicinity of the city. True lovers of sport are patiently awaiting the time when the season opens, and then the bombardment will commence. Grouse are reported plentiful in all of the hunting sections near the city and good sport is assured those who await the proper time.

Summer Schedule

The summer schedule of the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad has been inaugurated between Portland, Astoria, Gearhart and Seaside in connection with special round trip excursion tickets to all Clatsop and North Beach points, and trains leave Union Depot at 8:00 a.m., daily and run through direct, arriving at Astoria at 11:30 a.m., Gearhart 12:30 p.m. and Seaside at 12:30 p.m.

The Portland and Seaside Flyer leaves Union Depot every Saturday at 2:30 p.m., arriving at Astoria 5:50 p.m. and runs through direct, arriving at Gearhart 6:40 p.m. and Seaside at 6:50 p.m.

In connection with this improved service, special round trip season excursion tickets are sold from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points at rate of \$4.00 for the round trip, good for return passage until October 15th.

Special commutation tickets, good for five round trips, are sold from Portland to same points for \$15.00, good to return until October 15th.

Saturday special round trip excursion tickets from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points on sale every Saturday at rate of \$2.50 for round trip, good to return Sunday.

Tickets sold from Portland to North Beach points are issued in connection with the O R & N steamers from Astoria, and baggage is transferred to and from depot and steamer dock at Astoria free of charge, and all tickets sold by the O R & N Co from Portland to Clatsop and North Beach points, are interchangeable and will be honored on trains of this company in either direction between Portland and Astoria.

Ticket sold at all O R & N stations and passengers wishing to go to points on Clatsop Beach should so specify, in order to avoid confusing this popular resort with that of Long Beach, Wash., which is reached only by boat at Astoria, thus causing delays enroute.

Notice To Water Consumers

All persons known or themselves to be in arrears for city water are hereby notified to call at the office of the city Recorder and settle at once. In order that there may be no mis understanding we cite the customer to the following section of the city ordinance. This ordinance will be enforced.

Section 28—The water rates shall be payable in advance at the office of the water superintendent on the first day of each month (except for meters which are payable on the first day of the succeeding month), and if not paid within the first ten days the water will be shut off the premises, as provided in Sections 26 and 27.

Later ordinance provides that water rates shall be payable to City Recorder instead of Water Superintendent.
