Union the Seventh County in the State

The annual apportionment of the common school fund interest among the different counties of the state has been made by State Treasurer Moore and State Superintendent Ackerman. The total amount apportioned was \$260,176.50, the largest in the history of the state for a single year. The apportionment was made at a per capita rate of \$1.70, the number of school children in Oregon being 158,045. The apportionment last year was made at a per capita rate of \$1.61 on a much smaller school population.
