Warm Weather Politics

A politician of this city who has figured in all of the varied political complications, city, county and state in which Union county in past years had been aligned, gave forth the following possibility which may throw quite all the politicians in this county, irrespective of party, into a sudden and fierce scramble for the office of circuit judge.

As is well known, Judge Eakin very creditably holds his position and if permitted to fill out his present term, there will be no vacancy, but, as is also well known that there is a present vacancy in the United States district judgeship of this state and that President Roosevelt is taking his time in finding the man, and it is further well known by those who are well acquainted with Judge Eakin that he undoubtedly is just such a man as the President would take delight in appointing, if the character and ability of Judge Eakin could be placed before the President by those whose counsel he relies upon. Now in case Judge Eakin should be appointed, there would be a vacancy to be filled by Governor Chamberlain, and naturally Mayor Slater, Judge Ramsey, Turner Oliver and Frank Willson, of this county and Attorney Sheehan of Wal-lows county, would be in line for promotion, all being staunch co-workers of the same political faith of our democratic governor. With the above result, the only scramble at first would be among our democratic brethren, however there would be an awakening among the republican attorneys to secure the nomination red hot from the dear people under the primary law. But here is another possibility, from Portland, the political center, comes the heralded possibility that Judge Bean of the supreme court, may be nominated by the President and to fill this vacancy, which would give our jolly good natured and cunning democratic governor a chance to engratiate himself with no small number of republican voters all over the state by appointing Judge Eakin the supreme bench. Union county, although republican, gave Mr Chamberlain over 8000 majority and our sage stated that democrats of standing in the state were ready to suggest the above program, in case Judge Bean should win the district judgeship. This would give the governor an opportunity to make two appointments. If either of the above possibilities should come about it requires no great foresight to see that politics in Union county will commence within twenty minutes after the receipt of the news in this county. In the meantime however, until these possibilities have either materialized or have vanished, the voters may rest assured that they will

be properly recognized by the legal profession of both parties. Our democratic brethren in either event would come into possession of the judgeship first and they would naturally desire the indorsement of the representative men of their party on the outset and then would want votes to continue them in office after next June. And until the primaries, many of the republican attorneys would be after the nomination. As this county is normally 600 republican, the republicans naturally have the best of it at the polls.

Not all the politics however, is based upon the judgeship. Many are studying the new primary law and are eagerly, just at this time feeling of the public pulse with reference to their standing among the masses. Heretofore the fight was made largely after the delegates were selected, but now the voters of the respective parties do the nominating. Naturally the republicans are more active and they are more likely to be rewarded.
