The best crop grown this year at Echo is an entire loss. The warm weather in July cooked them.

The excursion to Portland and the grouse law going into effect this morning, there were only a few of the best of us left to the care of the town today.

Geo Miller states that threshing returns in his section of the valley show a heavier yield than the growers were estimating. This is especially true of fall sown grain.

John Walder was in the city this afternoon and states that he had completed threshing the Johnnie McNeely, Mulhollen, and the George Robertson fields, and finds that the average has exceeded forty five bushels per acre.

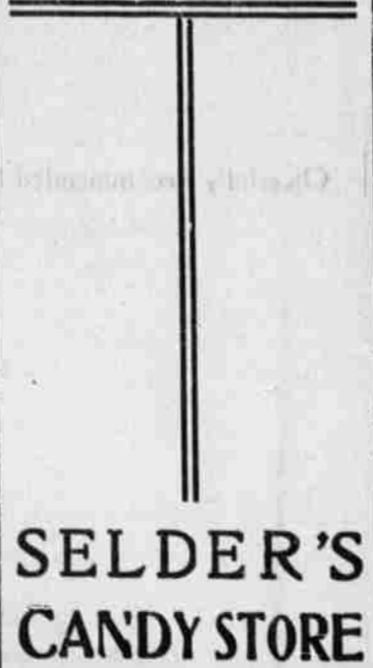
